

## BIOGRAPHICAL INFORMATION – David J. Dutelle

Dave Dutelle is an experienced business and project manager. He has had significant technical, project management, and managerial experiences in Product Development, Product Testing, Manufacturing, and Procurement. He has held senior management positions in a large multi-national corporation.

Dutelle has a B.S. degree in Electrical Engineering from Michigan Technological University. He participated in an MBA program from the University of Minnesota. He also participated in numerous executive management development and training programs in IBM.

Dutelle began his career in 1967 as a **test engineer** at **Honeywell Ordnance Division**. He was responsible for final test design and verification on the U S Navy's Mark 46 torpedo.

In 1968 he moved to **IBM Rochester** and took a position as **test engineer** for mid-range computer systems. He held various positions in design testing, 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> Level management, as well as new product test project management. In these capacities he was involved in development of IBM's very successful line of mid range computing systems including S/3, 32, 34, 36, 38, and AS/400.

He took a management position in IBM's disk drive development group and was a key member of the team that designed and developed IBM's first 3 ½ hard disk drive. He was in charge of transferring the product and technology to another IBM site in Japan for manufacturing.

In 1998, Dutelle was appointed **2<sup>nd</sup> level manager in AS/400 processor development**. He managed the development of hardware microcode, service microcode, technology procurement, early product testing, and overall hardware product development schedules.

He was appointed to a **senior management position in manufacturing** where he was responsible for manufacturing engineering, Quality, final test, and materials. He took on an additional **responsibility of AS/400 Worldwide Procurement**. In this capacity he managed the procurement of \$1.2B worth of parts for manufacturing. These parts were procured from all corners of the world.

Dutelle became **senior manager** of the IBM Rochester site electronic Card & Board Development. He managed this across development site for 3 years until his retirement from IBM. Shortly after retirement he became an **independent consultant** where he performed work for IBM as well as **Celestica** in processor development and electronic card manufacturing.

Dutelle also served two 3 year terms on the **Rochester Golf and Country Club (RGCC) Board of Directors** and most recently spent four months as the RGCC Marketing and Membership Director. He was responsible for bringing in 90 new members in a very short period of time.
